We have an opening for the following position available at Centurion Cargo.

QUALITY CONTROL INSPECTOR

Reports to: Supervisor of Quality Control

Hours: Full Time

Responsible Area: Oversight, Maintenance, and Inspection Program, not limited to Hangar, Line and Heavy Maintenance assigned, aircraft, receiving inspection, review and audit of paperwork packages for all aircraft maintenance. Specific review and audit functions as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications (14 CFR 65.83)

The Quality Control Specialist will hold a current mechanic certificate with an airframe and powerplant rating, and will have at least three (3) years of experience in the maintenance of large aircraft while holding the Airframe and Powerplant rating.

The Quality Control Specialist will have knowledge of the Company's General Maintenance Manual, and the maintenance and inspection program. He/she will be knowledgeable of 14 CFR Regulations 121.365(b)(c), and 121.369(b)(3), Part 121.378, and Part 43.9. Proper training in accordance with Company Maintenance Manual and Federal Aviation Regulations, and thorough knowledge of the processes and procedures contained in the Company General Maintenance Manual (GMM), are required.

The Quality Control Specialist will have at least three years of experience within the past six years performing one of, or a combination of, the following functions:

1. Maintaining large airplanes with 10 or more passenger seats—including, at the time of appointment as the Quality Control Specialist, experience in maintaining the same category and class of aircraft as used by the Company; **or**
2. Repairing airplanes in a certificated airplane repair station that is rated to maintain airplanes in the same category and class as used by the Company.

Notwithstanding the above, the person must have in the preceding 24 months:

1. At least served as a mechanic under his certificate and rating
2. Technically supervised other mechanics
3. Supervised, in an executive capacity, the maintenance or alteration of
aircraft or
4. Been engaged in any combination of 1, 2, or 3 above.
5. Good written and oral communication skills.

Summary of Duties & Responsibilities

The QC Inspector is accountable to the Supervisor of Quality Control and is responsible for performing the Quality Control functions, not limited to the efficient and economic determination of airworthiness of aircraft maintenance work assigned to them. Duties will include, but may not be limited to:

- The performance of inspection functions in accordance with the Maintenance Program, AD, SB or other requirement to ensure aircraft, engines, appliances and components are maintained to a prescribed standard in order to continue their airworthiness. Provides a quality oversight for all maintenance activities.
- Performs preliminary, in progress, hidden damage and final inspections. Performs special inspections as detailed by the requesting or required document. Performs Required Inspection Item (RII), buy-back inspection, and the Aircraft Airworthiness Release.
- Performs receiving inspections to ensure the use of legal, conforming and applicable parts and materials including proper documentation conforms to acceptable quality standards and complies with Company and FAA Regulatory policy.
- Ensures that inspections and surveillance are performed as required on necessary maintenance actions in order to assure the use of approved data, material, tools and test equipment and those high standards of workmanship are present
- Provide guidance and assistance to maintenance personnel in order to train, maintain, and enhance compliance to programs, policies and procedures.
- Perform assigned inspection functions in accordance with the Company maintenance manual to ensure that the Company aircraft are maintained to the prescribed standard of airworthiness and serviceability for all scheduled operations.
- Conduct audits of aircraft work packages including checks/inspections forms, log pages, routines and non-routines, modification orders, etc. to ensure completion, correctness, use of appropriate references to approved data in all entries and forms.
- Review the aircraft log book at each "A" check and above to ensure that all pilot reports and deferred maintenance items are placed on appropriate non-routine work cards.
- During the first ten (10) days of each month, review and address the calibrated tools and equipment status and shelf-life status and ensure correction of any discovered discrepancies.
- Perform as a "Designated Instructor" in areas and/or on subjects as qualified and approved by the Director of Quality Control.
- Performs the inspection of SOP Program, tagging items and documents results per the SOP Program.
- Perform Internal and/or external audits, both in-house as well as outside vendors in accordance with Chapter 7 of the General Maintenance Manual, and as assigned by the Supervisor of Quality Control.
- Perform all other duties as assigned by the Supervisor of Quality Control.
